6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- 1) Lectures allotted by university authority are conducted by the teachers.
- 2) Extra classes for backward students have been engaged.
- 3) Various U.G.C. courses for development of students have been taken e.g. C.O.C. etc. Students use library facility for the reference books and other text books.
- 4) There is also a facility of reading room for students along with the broadband internet equipped computers.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

University authority has pioneered semester system for examinations of U.G. and P.G. courses. For under graduate students seminars and projects are scheduled for 10 marks in the first semester and 10 marks in the second semester. Examinations are conducted by college itself. 


