Students use library facility for the reference books and other text books.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

University authority has pioneered semester system for examinations of U.G. and P.G. courses. For under graduate students seminars and projects are scheduled for 10 marks in the first semester and 10 marks in the second semester. Examinations are conducted by college itself. Assessment of first year degree courses is done at college level by respective teachers and remaining by the exam department, Shivaji University, Kolhapur at appointed CAP centres. For P.G. level, the project work, seminar, oral tests and assignments from the students are carried out for 20 marks in each semester.




